ADVENTURE TO THE UNKNOWN

It Takes ONE Man...

It all started when Samuel Mwangi visited Goma town in the eastern Congo in 2003 where he saw hopelessness and misery among the locals. Samuel had traveled from Nairobi, Kenya to Goma city in DRC for a leaders' conference aimed to bring healing to this war torn country. It was during this mission that Samuel inquired about the pygmies who lived in the forests. Initially his questions were rooted in curiosity of wanting to see the short Bambuti pygmies.


A year later, in August 2004, Samuel witnessed real devastation and misery when he came face to face with the Bambuti pygmies in the Congo forests. Traveling through the jungle was a nightmare but his determination could not stop him. In the company of two other Kenyans, John and Rebecca, Samuel beheld and shared experiences with Bambuti children who had never been to school, old men who had never changed their clothes and women who had been raped by the militia groups in the forests.

What Samuel thought would be a fun adventure turned out to be a tearful day. He sobbed to see families worship Tore, a forest god whom pygmies believed supplied animals to hunters. He felt desperate to see the children dying due to malaria and cold and hopeless men who could not provide for their families.

Inspired, Samuel, returned several times to DRC where she shared the gospel of Jesus Christ, donated clothes and food to dying families. In 2008, Samuel published a researched based book, *"The Pygmy World: The Endangered Bambuti of Congo"* based on the plight of the pygmy communities in DR Congo.


In Memory of Jean Chappel

It Takes ONE Story

JEAN CHAPPEL



In 2011, Jean Chappel got hold of a book regarding the pygmies of Congo that Pastor Samuel Mwangi, Executive Director of PIPES International had published in 2008. She was moved by the plight of the pygmy people. I would like to share in her own words the steps she took when she read the book.

.....

In 2011, my husband Gurry purchased the book "The Pygmy World: The Endangered Bambuti of Congo" published by Samuel Mwangi. He read the book regarding the plight of the Bambuti Pygmy peoples and then gave it to me to read.

I cried my way through the book and took it to the Bible study group in Florissant, Missouri where members read the book and we prayed over it. We decided that there was not a lot we could do but what we could do we needed to do.

We decided we would do a parking lot sale and we would see if we could get people who had so much unused stuff stored in basements, garages and attics.

We asked them to donate some of their good stuff which they were not using that we could sell in the parking lot and send support to Democratic Republic of Congo for the Pygmy people.

Samuel had gotten some donations from people in Boston and had gone to Congo to start a school for the pygmy children most of them coming from the forests at that time. He borrowed land to build a ramshackle building and borrowed a cooking pot to make food for the children. Meanwhile, here in St. Louis, we had our garage sale in August 2011 and Esther (Samuel's fiancée) was there. When Samuel got back to America we had enough money to help his efforts in Congo and to buy a cooking pot.

Later the same year, Samuel, Esther and I sat down at the shop and named agreed to name our organization Partnership for Indigenous Peoples-PIPES International. We had several sales a year and we began to get online donations.

Our Heavenly Father has multiplied the effort and we bought land and built a school in Mugunga near Goma city and also purchased community land in Idjwi Island-DRC to enable families grow food and live there. They don't have to move from one place to another. The work continues and we have had many Bibles handed out and many baptisms in different countries. Thousands have heard the gospel of Jesus Christ not only in Africa but also in Asia. This is really exciting work and more places to go.

Some time ago, I was informed of an orphaned boy who needed help with education. Our Kenyan team responded and registered Moses in a private school. On my birthday, January 9, 2019, I went to see Moses and was overjoyed to see a happy and hopeful boy. Today, Moses is the top performing student in his class.
